"Public transport accessibility and network performance in Zurich and a global sample of 21 cities" by Dr. Jan Scheurer

Abstract:

The co-evolution of public transport systems and urban form may be a defining feature of the contemporary European city. But in the light of differing urban histories, cultures and planning systems, the theme takes on many guises across the continent. In this talk, we will explore the comparative results from the application of the Spatial Network Analysis for Multimodal Urban Transport Systems (SNAMUTS) accessibility assessment tool to Zurich and twenty other cities in Europe, Australasia and North America, highlight their strengths and weaknesses in maximising the role of public transport throughout their metro regions, and reflect on what constitutes international best practice in this context.


Presenter's bio:
